The Foundation for Aspiring Minority Accountants, Inc. will provide mentorship to selected undergraduate students of African-American, Hispanic, and Asian descent who are interested in an undergraduate degree in the field of accounting. Mentees will receive support with homework, tutoring, and guidance in finding employment.

2022 FAMA Undergraduate Mentoring Program Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicant must be an African-American, Hispanic, and/or Asian student
- Applicant must attend a college/university and reside in the United States
- Applicant must be seeking an Accounting degree at a college/university

2022 Undergraduate Mentoring Program Application Packet Requirements:

The applicant will be required to submit an application form, two (2) letters of recommendation, a resume, a photo, and write an essay to be considered for the program. A transcript will also be required.

The essay must include answers to the following questions:

- Why are you interested in the FAMA Undergraduate Mentoring Program?
- What would you like out of your relationship with your Mentor?
- The essay should be double-spaced and a minimum of six hundred (600) words.

Letters of Recommendation:

- A college/university faculty member; written on the school's original letterhead (mandatory)
- A place of employment from a manager; written on the organization's original letterhead (or)
- A community service organization; written on the organization's original letterhead (or)
- A personal recommendation from someone other than a relative

Application Deadline:

The completed application and supporting documents must be submitted by **Friday, July 1, 2022**, to be considered for the mentoring program. After this date, no applications will be accepted.

Selection Process:

- The FAMA Mentorship Committee will review each application received by the deadline
- The FAMA Mentorship Committee will choose applicants to advance to the interview
- The FAMA Mentorship Committee will interview each chosen applicants
- The FAMA Mentorship Committee will select the Undergraduate Mentoring Program recipients
