The Foundation for Aspiring Minority Accountants, Inc. will provide mentorship to selected junior and senior high school students of African-American, Hispanic, and Asian descent who are interested in an undergraduate degree in business and/or accounting and need homework and tutoring support in high school.

2022 FAMA High School Mentoring Program Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicant must be an African-American, Hispanic, and/or Asian student
- Applicant must attend high school and reside in the United States
- Applicant must be interested in majoring in Business or Accounting at a college/university

High School Mentoring Program Application Packet Requirements:

The applicant will be required to submit an application form, one (1) letter of recommendation, a photo, and write an essay to be considered for the program. A transcript will also be required.

The essay must include answers to the following questions:

- Why are you interested in the FAMA High School Mentoring Program?
- What would you like out of your relationship with your Mentor?
- The essay should be double-spaced and a minimum of five hundred (500) words.

Letters of Recommendation:

- A high school faculty member; written on the school's original letterhead (or)
- A community service organization; written on the organization's original letterhead

Application Deadline:

The completed application and supporting documents must be submitted by **Friday, July 1, 2022**, to be considered for the mentoring program. After this date, no applications will be accepted.

Selection Process:

- The FAMA Scholarship Committee will review each application received by the deadline
- The FAMA Scholarship Committee will choose applicants to advance to the interview
- The FAMA Scholarship Committee will interview each chosen applicants
- The FAMA Scholarship Committee will select the High School Mentoring Program recipients
